Brett is embracing life by helping others

Who would have thought that pet sitting a cat in a friend's house could change your life forever? Well, this is exactly what happened to Brett.

For two-and-a-half years, Brett was living in a Unity transitional housing property in Marion after returning to Adelaide from Melbourne and having nowhere to live. During this time he embraced the many opportunities to participate in the tenant group activities such as cooking, art classes and fortnightly bushwalks. Brett says this experience “brought a whole new perspective” to his life.

Whilst living in the Marion property, Brett went to stay in Macclesfield to look after his friend's cat for a couple of weeks. Brett enjoyed his time in Macclesfield, living in the country. Shortly after returning to Marion, Unity was able to offer Brett an opportunity to transition into permanent housing and the property just happened to be in Macclesfield.

It was during last year that Brett's life took yet another amazing turn. Brett was accepted to participate in a short, full time course for Wellness Recovery Action Plan (WRAP), which is a self-designed prevention and wellness process that can be used to get and stay well. Following his participation in the course, Brett was asked if he would be interested in assisting with teaching future courses. Brett was delighted to accept this opportunity and he went on to assist with teaching an eight-week part-time course at Noarlunga.

Brett followed this up by undertaking a Certificate II in Peer Work and has now been asked to participate in an upcoming Food and Mood Course aimed at education around how food affects mental health. Brett may also be involved in future courses on budgeting and exercise.

Brett says he is “loving life at the moment”. Very close to Brett is his uncle who recently said Brett is blessed and lucky, and he is pleased to see how far he has come in the last few months. Brett also quoted his Nanna who continually told him “there is no such word as can't, and that everything happens for a reason”.

We hope Brett continues to enjoy his home in the country and remains motivated to help and support others.



Brett jumped at the chance to move back to the country, having grown up in Woods Point, near Murray Bridge. “I grew up in the country and when we moved to Adelaide it took me a couple of years to get used to it,” he says. “The country offers me freedom and it feels like being back at home again. New phone app can help you cut costs


The Salvation Army and the South Australian Government have created 'Affordable SA', a phone application that provides a range of information, practical tips and tools to help support households to manage the cost of living.
