This has been a big first year for Unity and we have been endorsed as one of a select group of Providers by Housing SA and Mental Health.

As a Housing SA Preferred Growth Provider, Unity will be eligible to compete for future resources and will be eligible to receive housing through the Commonwealth Government's Economic Stimulus Package.

As a selected partner with Mental Health, Unity will deliver 36 houses to provide supported accommodation to some of the most vulnerable people in our community.

Unity Facts

- Unity received the 2008 Professional Excellence SA Award for Housing Management from the Australasian Housing Institute in recognition of the establishment of Unity Housing Company Ltd
- Unity has 820 properties across metropolitan Adelaide offering a continuum of housing options from affordable rental through to supported housing
- Unity has a tenancy training house available for agencies to use with their clients to teach cleaning skills, cooking, how to use household machinery, clothing care, washing, ironing, gardening, preparing a budget etc
- Unity has 163 beds in boarding house style accommodation across 5 sites in the city. Options range from single room accommodation with shared facilities to independent apartment style living

- Unity Support Services provide specialist support which assists 140 people each year to access or maintain housing in the city and inner metropolitan area
