

Free health helpline

for multicultural communities

A new health helpline can support multicultural communities to get health information and advice.

Multicultural Health Connect is free and confidential, and run by workers from multicultural backgrounds.

The helpline offers people from multicultural backgrounds free health advice in their own language, including:

- expert health advice from a nurse
- finding doctors, hospitals, and community health centres
- finding nearby support services
- learning about COVID-19, including how to get a vaccination, protecting themselves and their family, and how to manage COVID-19 symptoms.

The caller can be an Australian citizen or here on a visa of any kind.

A trained worker will answer the call. They will ask some questions, including which language the caller wants to speak. The helpline has interpreters for 160 languages and connects to the Translating and Interpreting Service to speak with the caller in their language.

Multicultural Health Connect is not an emergency service. If the call is an emergency, dial Triple Zero (000) immediately.

Examples of questions you can ask:

"My son has a bad cough and a sore throat. His skin feels hot, so he might have a fever. What should I do and where can I take him?"

"I recently moved from India to Australia, and I don't have a Medicare card. Do I need to pay to see a doctor?"

"I feel alone because I'm in Australia without my family. Can you help me?"

Food brings out the best in



Food has always been an important part of Bandit's life and culture and she has enjoyed cooking since she was a little girl.


Bandit was born in Laos and the village she lived in did not have any shops, so families had to cook everything they ate. The children would also collect rice every morning and sometimes make banana leaf rolls to offer to the local monks as part of their Buddhist traditions. As a child, Bandit imagined growing older, having her own family, and teaching her children to cook, as her mother did for her.

In Laos, food is a symbol of luck. Bandit enjoys cooking because she likes to give luck to other people, and it is a way of connecting to and sharing culture.

Bandit loves to make all kinds of meals and she likes to eat different things each day, and her favourite dish to make is larb as this dish is made for good luck. Larb can be made with different kinds of meat and is prominent in all Lao celebrations and ceremonies. Bandit says if friends come to visit they will ask, "Where is the larb?".

Bandit enjoys living in Naracoorte where she has the independence of her own house, she can drive herself places, and she is able to do the things she likes which is mostly cooking and caring for her evergrowing garden, where she grows some of her own food.
