Mark is one of the first tenants to call our new development at Henley Beach South home. He moved into his new two-bedroom rental apartment in May 2025, complete with ensuite, balcony and so much more.

"I'm the luckiest guy in the world," he says. "It's a full-circle moment."

Mark lived at this very site previously – when it was occupied by 52 SA Housing Trust units – and is grateful to be back in the beachside community. "I've come a long way in the last 10 to 15 years and now I've come back to here, bigger and better than ever, just like this apartment," he says.


Mark was a boarding house tenant with Unity Housing for nearly a decade and knows what it's like to sleep rough. "I'd do anything not to be in that position again," he says. "Having a base to call my own gives me confidence and purpose."

Before moving to Henley Beach South, Mark began looking for a place of his own, but the housing crisis locked him out of the private rental market.

"I didn't think there was any way I'd be able to get a place like this," he says. "For people like me, who work part time and are on a disability pension, it's almost impossible to rent. It was exhausting and tiring. It was a nightmare to be honest."

Having stable accommodation has enabled Mark to re-engage with the community and gain valuable skills working as a *Big Issue* vendor, and more recently as a delivery driver.

"Stable housing is very important," he says. "It's a foundation to get the rest of your life going."


A partnership between Unity and the SA Housing Trust, the project has been built on a redeveloped SA Housing Trust site. It was designed by City Collective and built by Centina.

Each session focused on mindfulness, encouraging tenants to explore their five senses - sight, sound, taste, smell, and touch - in thoughtful and engaging ways. Activities included mindful eating, nature walks, and a lively drumming session that had everyone moving and laughing.

Every week ended with a peaceful meditation to help wind down.

Four tenants attended regularly, bringing different ages and life experiences to the group. The sessions created a warm and respectful space where everyone felt safe to share and support one another.

Tenants said the sessions helped them feel more relaxed and present. As Sal put it, "It's been great, it's taught me to appreciate the moment and not take things too seriously." It was a meaningful and uplifting experience for all involved.

# Winter warmer meals on a budget

During the colder months, a warm comforting meal can keep you feeling cozy and nourished. And you don't need to spend a lot to cook delicious winter dishes that are healthy and filling. Simple ingredients like lentils, beans, root vegetables, rice, and pasta can go a long way in hearty soups, stews, and casseroles. Meals like vegetable soup, slow-cooked curries, or baked pasta can feed the whole family for just a few dollars.

# Try this tasty Chow Mein recipe from our Naracoorte tenant Gloria.



Prep: 20 min | Simmer: 30-45 min | Serves: 4

### **Ingredients**

- 2 pork chops, diced or 500g pork mince
- 2 rashers bacon, diced
- 1 onion, diced
- 230g beans, chopped (approx. 1 cup)
- ½ cabbage, shredded
- 1 packet chicken noodle soup
- 4 tablespoons uncooked rice
- 2 cups water
- 1 teaspoon curry powder
- 1 tablespoon butter
- Salt and pepper to taste

## Cooking steps

- 1. Fry pork mince/chops and bacon with onion and butter, until slightly browned.
- 2. Add shredded cabbage, beans, chicken noodle soup mix, rice and water, curry powder and salt and pepper.
- 3. Simmer slowly for 30-45 minutes, stirring occasionally.
